Dr Heredia has taught at CIDE since 2009, in the Department of International Studies. He is an economist with extensive experience in international relations. He speaks Spanish, English, and French.

He was awarded his BA in Economics by ITAM in Mexico City, his MA in Economics by McGill University, Montréal, and his PhD in Economics by UNAM in Mexico City.

He served a Member of Mexico's 57th Congress in the Chamber of Deputies in 1997-2000. Since 2012 he is part of the Advisory Board of the Mexico Institute at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars, where he became a non-resident Global Fellow in 2020.

Since 2020, he serves on the Board of COMEXUS, The US-Mexico Commission for Educational & Cultural Exchanges. He has worked for two decades with U.S. hometown associations of migrant workers from Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, and Honduras.

He is the author of *'Geopolitical Landscapes of Donald Trump: International Relations and Institutional Characteristics of Mexico-Guatemala Relations'* (forthcoming).
